Computer and Internet User Agreement

To use the public computers with Internet access at the Clarendon Hills Public Library, the user must agree to abide by the terms of this agreement.

- A valid library card, in good standing is required to access Internet workstations.
- Guest registrations are available for people who are visiting the area. Area residents who are eligible for library service within the SWAN Consortia must have a library card.
- Use of another person's library card or identification to sign up for Internet use is not allowed.
- The user understands that Internet service provided by the Clarendon Hills Public Library (CHPL) is ***unfiltered***.
- Access to the Internet is available to all ages. Knowing that the CHPL computers are not filtered, if a parent would not like their child under age 18 to have access to the Internet while at the CHPL, the parent should notify the library to have their child's library card blocked from Internet use.
- The user recognizes that the Library cannot be held responsible for content on the Internet.
- The user must obey local, state and federal laws including but not limited to copyright, fraud, obscenity and privacy.
- The Internet will not be used for any purpose that harasses others, that violates the library's security system, or that violates licensing agreements.
- Personal usage will not disrupt others, including but not limited to display of offensive audio or visual material.
- The user will not damage or alter the library's equipment, software or network.
- Users may not install, copy or download software from any source onto the Library's computers.
- Users may only save to an external device such as a USB flash drive.
- The user will abide by the limits for daily usage as set by the library. You get 1 hour of uninterrupted usage. If no one is waiting, you can extend your time in 30 minute increments until you have reached your 2 hour daily limit.
- No more than two people may work at one computer station at a time.
